Holiday Learning for the Whole Family

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During this year's holiday season, challenge your family to continue learning and make it a fun family activity. It doesn't matter how old each member of your family is, they can continue to learn. Mom, dad, sister, brother, grandmother, grandfather – everyone can learn at their own level! Here are a few ideas to get started.

Literacy

Ask all family members to find a holiday themed book to read. Whether it's fiction or non-fiction, everyone spends 30 minutes a day reading their book. Time can be scheduled where you all do it together or you can trust that everyone will find their own time to read. Have a family check-in every few days to see what their stories are about or what they have learned so far while reading.

Math

Host an ongoing Math competition over the holiday break by solving different types of math problems every day. The problems can be geared towards whatever level(s) mom, dad, grandmother, grandfather, sister or brother are on. You can use math facts, word problems, algebra, geometry or even math sudoku puzzles (a quick Google search can help or try <u>Sudoku.com</u>!). You can have teams or go head to head with your family members. At the end of the break, determine the winner. They can claim the "winner" title until the next competition.

Science

Perform a science experiment over the holiday break! Since we don't get very much snow in Georgia, create your own snowstorm in a jar (one video <u>HERE</u>)! Be sure to ask all the questions before, during and after the experiment.

Social Studies/Foreign Language

Each family member selects a country and does some research on it. What kind of government

they have? What is the favorite sport of the country? How many people live there? What is the climate like? How do they celebrate the holidays? Family members can even learn a phrase or two from their country's language (<u>Duolingo</u> can help!). The possibilities are endless! Each day or every few days, everyone will report what they have learned about their country. Discuss similarities and differences between the countries.

Whatever your family does over the holiday break to continue learning, do it together. Enjoy the holiday pace and make memories that will last a lifetime. We look forward to seeing you and all our students in 2024! Happy Holidays!

Reading and Writing Through the Holidays

Our English Learners have had a wonderful year so far, full of hard work and so much progress! Although it is time for a holiday vacation, they don't need a break from learning! The holidays are a fantastic time to help your child continue to learn. If you have a computer or tablet with internet access, your child can work on Lexia Reading Core5 (K-5) or Lexia Power Up (6-12). However, there are many other ways to encourage reading and writing through the Holiday Break.

- Tell stories! Listening to stories is a great way to help your English learner build vocabulary. The holidays are a good time to share family stories. Your child could retell the stories they hear or draw a picture of the story.
- Another way to build reading skills is to listen to stories. <u>PBS kids</u> on YouTube offers many great choices that the whole family can enjoy. Storyline Online is another way to listen to stories (https://storylineonline.net/).
- Reading books in English as well as in your Home Language will also improve your English Learner's reading skills. The public library is a free resource for books for the whole family. You and your EL can choose to read a story for fun or find an informational book to learn something new. Our local public libraries also offer storytime and other fun activities for all ages. Check out the library <u>calendars</u> for more information.
- We love for our ELs to practice writing! There are many opportunities for authentic writing during the holidays. Your child could make a shopping list, write a thank you note for a gift, keep a journal of holiday events, or even write a letter to Santa. Even our youngest ELs can draw pictures and label them, or try to write the letter sounds they hear.
- One of the best parts of the holiday season is all of the delicious food! Following a recipe is a fun way to practice reading and math skills.
- Having a conversation in ANY language is valuable practice for your child. We want our Bilingual Super Heroes to use both languages for speaking and listening. Talk with your child as you ride in the car, work on chores at home, or shop for food.


